CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of ROCK CREEK, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 0.02 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit 41277. The date of priority is DECEMBER 13, 1976. The right is limited to not more than 0.005 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 5, T 1 S, R 2 W, W.M.; 50 FEET SOUTH AND 160 FEET WEST FROM N 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 5.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. Water shall not be appropriated during the period from July 31 through September 15 of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.02 ACRE
SECTION 5
TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

MORE EXPLICITLY DESCRIBED AS BEING WITHIN LOT 33, TRACT 16, FAIRVIEW ADDITION, CITY OF HILLSBORO.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
