## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WALTER ALBERTSON HC 60, BOX 2220 LAKEVIEW, OREGON 97630

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the COTTONWOOD CREEK BASIN for the purpose of PRIMARY IRRIGATION OF 60.5 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 59.5 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit G-9327. The date of priority is MAY 5, 1981. The right is limited to not more than 1.5 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

SW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 32, T 39 S, R 19 E, W.M.; 1375 FEET SOUTH AND 20 FEET EAST FROM THE W 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 32.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:
