CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

RUTH C. AND RHEA M. GRAY  
ROUTE 2, BOX 43  
WALLA WALLA, WASHINGTON 99362

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the MUD CREEK BASIN for the purpose of SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 152.6 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit G-9781. The date of priority is JANUARY 28, 1982. The right is limited to not more than 1.10 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

NW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 19, T 6 N, R 35 E, W.M.; 870 FEET SOUTH AND 1300 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER OF SECTION 9.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4	40.0 ACRES
NW 1/4 NW 1/4	33.2 ACRES
SW 1/4 NW 1/4	39.4 ACRES
SE 1/4 NW 1/4	40.0 ACRES
SECTION 19	
TOWNSHIP 6 NORTH, RANGE 35 EAST, W.M.	

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
