CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

DANIEL F. HERING 34005 SW COOK STREET HILLSBORO, OREGON 97123

confirms the right to use the waters of the TUALATIN RIVER, a tributary of the WILLAMETTE RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 127.0 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit 46950. The date of priority is MARCH 10, 1982. The right is limited to not more than 1.59 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 11, T 1 S, R 3 W, W.M.; 1920 FEET NORTH AND 1040 FEET WEST FROM THE SE CORNER OF SECTION 11.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 16.1 ACRES SW 1/4 SE 1/4 7.5 ACRES SE 1/4 SE 1/4 39.9 ACRES SECTION 11

NE 1/4 SW 1/4 28.5 ACRES NW 1/4 SW 1/4 25.5 ACRES SECTION 12

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 6.4 ACRES NW 1/4 NE 1/4 3.1 ACRES SECTION 14

TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
