## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

JACK HEIPLE 2055 7TH AVENUE W. VALE, OREGON 97918

confirms the right to use the waters of JOHNSON SPRINGS, a tributary of WILLOW CREEK, for the purpose of SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 30.3 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit 42597. The date of priority is OCTOBER 24, 1977. The right is limited to not more than 0.25 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 22, T 17 S, R 44 E, W.M.; 170 FEET SOUTH AND 250 FEET WEST FROM THE N 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 22.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4 29.8 ACRES NW 1/4 NW 1/4 0.5 ACRE SECTION 22 TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 44 EAST, W.M.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
