CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

DIEGO LEON
1275 DRY CREEK ROAD
MOSIER, OREGON 97040

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the MOSIER CREEK BASIN for IRRIGATION OF 18.8 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit U-239. The date of priority is MARCH 25, 1947. This right is limited to 0.235 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 7, T 2 N, R 12 E, W.M.; 900 FEET SOUTH AND 3300 FEET EAST FROM THE W 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7.

The amount of water used for irrigation together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 SE 1/4 18.8 ACRES
SECTION 7
TOWNSHIP 2 NORTH, RANGE 12 EAST, W.M.

Land on which water is to be used is a part of that more explicitly described by appropriator as follows:

All of Tracts 9, 20, 11, 12, and 13 in Elliott Orchard Tracts, containing in all 55.78 acres, according to the official plat thereof on record in the office of the County Clerk of Wasco County, Oregon.

The quantity of water appropriated at the new well, shall not exceed 0.235 cubic foot per second and shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original well under the subject right.

The following provisions shall be carried out when in the judgement of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install measuring devices:

the pump system shall include an access port for measuring the water level;

the pump system shall include an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the user is entitled;

the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUNE 17, 1988, and supersedes Certificate 20801, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
