CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

JERRY KEYES 7875 HARMONY ROAD SHERIDAN, OREGON 97378

confirms the right to use the waters of MILL CREEK, a tributary of SOUTH YAMHILL RIVER, for POULTRY USE INCLUDING DRINKING WATER, CLEANING, AND COOLING.

This right was perfected under Permit 18028. The date of priority is JULY 28, 1947. This right is limited to 0.15 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 (AS PROJECTED WITHIN BLAIR DLC 41), SECTION 17, T 6 S, R 6 W, W.M.; 1310 FEET SOUTH AND 4110 FEET WEST FROM THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF BLAIR DLC 41.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4 AS PROJECTED WITHIN BLAIR DLC 41 SECTION 16 TOWNSHIP 6 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

The use of water is limited to the irrigation season, being APRIL 1 through SEPTEMBER 30 of each year.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 17, 1989, and together with Certificate 67366, supersedes Certificate 24618, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
