CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of FRY GULCH WITH ANY DEFICIENCY IN THE AVAILABLE SUPPLY FROM FRY GULCH TO BE MADE UP BY DIVERSION FROM WOODS CREEK, a tributary of WEST FORK ILLINOIS RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 2.2 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit 43354. The date of priority is JUNE 28, 1978. The right is limited to not more than 0.03 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 19, T 40 S, R 8 W, W.M.; FRY GULCH - 1100 FEET NORTH AND 70 FEET WEST; WOODS CREEK - 1110 FEET NORTH AND 230 FEET WEST, BOTH FROM THE SE CORNER OF SECTION 19.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 1.8 ACRES
SE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.4 ACRE
SECTION 19
TOWNSHIP 40 SOUTH, RANGE 8 WEST, W.M.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
