confirms the right to use the waters of BRIDGE CREEK, for IRRIGATION 23.9 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for WHEELER County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 12, at Page 388. The date of priority is 1896.

The use is limited to ONE-FORTIETH OF ONE CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND PER ACRE OF LAND IRRIGATED BEFORE JUNE 15, AND ONE-EIGHTIETH OF ONE CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND PER ACRE AFTER JUNE 15, DURING THE IRRIGATION SEASON FROM MARCH 1 TO OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.
