that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an one-half acre amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed One and one-half acre feet per acre in any 30-day period prior to June 1st, one acre foot per acre in any 30-day period after June 1st, of each year, or three acre feet per acre during any season diverted at a rate not to exceed one-twentieth of a cubic foot per second per acreia description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

12 acres in the SWINWI, 15 acres in the NVISWI and 15 acres in the SWISWI of Section 18; 15 acres in the NEWNEL, 10 acres in the SEINEL, 12 acres in the NEWSEZ and 17 acres in the SEISE, of Section 12, T. 16 S. R. 36 E. W. M., being a total of 96 acres.

The land in Section 18 transferred from Chas. Garvin, Ontario, Oregon.)

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place

of use herein described.
