## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

LONNY D. AND PAMELA A. BROWN P.O. BOX 235 MAUPIN, OREGON 97037

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the DESCHUTES RIVER BASIN for IRRIGATION OF 21.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-8342. The date of priority is JUNE 19, 1978. This right is limited to 0.26 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 32, T 5 S, R 16 E, W.M.; 1690 FEET SOUTH AND 1050 FEET WEST FROM THE NE CORNER OF SECTION 32.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4 4.4 ACRES
SW 1/4 NE 1/4 5.0 ACRES
SE 1/4 NE 1/4 10.7 ACRES

TOWNSHIP 5 SOUTH, RANGE 16 EAST, W.M.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered AUGUST 26, 1993, and supersedes Certificate 65419, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
