This is to Certify, That JOHN C. BOYER

of State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of

a tributary of Powder River for the purpose of Irrigation, Domestic inunder Permit No. 4111 of the State Francer, and that said right to the use of said waters
has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the wright in the right hereby
confirmed dates from June 4, 1919;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed

0.64 cubic foot per second:The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eighticth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the lands irrigated under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where the water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

25 acres in NE2SW2, 15 acres in SE2SW2, Section 2, 10 acres in

NELNWA, Section 11, T. 11 S. R. 39 E.W.M., in Baker County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of

Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty years from the date of priority of the right, as herein set forth, subject to a preference right of renewal under the laws existing at the date of the expiration of the right for power purposes, as hereby confirmed and limited.
