CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That REDLANDS DITCH & IRRIGATION COMPANY

of Kerby, State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of Sucker Creek

for the purpose of Irrigation and domestic for Tract #1; Irrigation for Tract #2;

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volumes 1 & 5, at page 253 & 398; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1893 for Tract #1; 1908 for Tract #2;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 2.12 cubic foot per second for Tract #1, 0.24 cubic foot per second for Tract #2, and that the use of water for irrigation purposes shall be confined to the season April 1 to October 31 of each year;

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Tract #1: 11.5 acres in the NE¹/₄ NW¹/₄, 2.5 acres in the NW¹/₄ NW¹/₄, 16 acres in the NE¹/₄ NE¹/₄, 5 acres in the NW¹/₄ NE¹/₄, Section 31, T. 39 S. R. 7 W. W. M.; 34 acres in Lot 1 (NE¹/₄ NE¹/₄), 54 acres in Lot 2 (NW¹/₄ NE¹/₄), 2 acres in the SW¹/₄ NE¹/₄, 1 acre in the SE¹/₄ NE¹/₄, Section 36, T. 39 S. R. 8 W. W. M., being a total of 106 acres.

Tract #2: 8 acres in the NE¹/₄ NW¹/₄, 6 acres in the NW¹/₄ NW¹/₄, Section 31, T. 39 S. R. 7 W. W. M., 1 acre in the NW¹/₄ NE¹/₄, 3.8 acres in the SW¹/₄ NE¹/₄, Section 36, T. 39 S. R. 8 W. W. M., being a total of 18.8 acres.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
