CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

GREG AND DEBRA EDDY
767 EAST MAIN STREET
JOHN DAY, OREGON 97845

confirms the right to use the waters of THE JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of THE COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATING 0.4 ACRE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for GRANT County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1875.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed 1/40 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND PER ACRE IRRIGATED FROM APRIL 1 TO SEPTEMBER 30; FURTHER LIMITED TO ONE ACRE FOOT PER ACRE PER CALENDAR MONTH TO JULY 1 AND 3/4 ACRE FOOT PER ACRE THEREAFTER; TOTAL 5.0 ACRE-FEET PER ACRE FOR SEASON, and that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 25, T 13 S, R 31 E, W.M.; 1900 FEET NORTH AND 4870 FEET WEST OF THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 NW 1/4 0.4 ACRE
SECTION 25
TOWNSHIP 13 SOUTH, RANGE 31 EAST, W.M.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water used. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION AND PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 31, 1989, and together with Certificate 61857, supersedes Certificate 43958, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

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The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
