## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

GERALD AND SYLVIA ADAMS 1564 GIBBON ROAD CENTRAL POINT, OR 97502

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the GRIFFIN CREEK BASIN for IRRIGATION OF 2.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11360. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 11, 1991. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.025 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The well is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 27, T 36 S, R 2 W, W.M.; 576.19 FEET SOUTH AND 359.26 FEET WEST OF THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 27.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acrefeet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 2.0 ACRES SECTION 27 TOWNSHIP 36 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with the prior SURFACE OR GROUNDWATER rights of others.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

When required by the department, the user shall install and maintain a weir, meter or other suitable measuring device and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

This use may be regulated if analysis of data available discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of this right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.
