CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

THE GRAND LODGE OF ANCIENT FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF OREGON P.O BOX 96 FOREST GROVE, OREGON 97116

confirms the right to use the waters of ONE WELL in the COUNCIL CREEK BASIN for IRRIGATION OF 17.8 ACRES AND COOLING.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11067. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 14, 1989. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.31 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.22 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.09 CFS FOR COOLING, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The well is located as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, AS PROJECTED WITHIN DLC 62, SECTION 32, T 1 N, R 3 W, W.M.; 2291 FEET SOUTH AND 525 FEET EAST FROM THE SE CORNER OF DLC 79.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acrefeet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NE 1/4 SW 1/4 0.32 ACRE SE 1/4 SW 1/4 17.48 ACRES BOTH AS PROJECTED WITHIN DLC 62 SECTION 32 TOWNSHIP 1 NORTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

The right to appropriate water for cooling as allowed herein shall be inferior in priority to all subsequent rights for beneficial consumptive uses and/or to rights of those appropriators who make use of a standard low-temperature geothermal effluent disposal system unless a standard low-temperature effluent disposal system is developed and used as defined in Oregon Administrative Rules, Chapter 690-230-140.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. When required by the department, the water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with the prior SURFACE AND GROUNDWATER rights of others.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
