CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CARL A. PIERSON

confirms the right to use the waters of the UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of the Tualatin River, for the IRRIGATION OF 4.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 31750. The date of priority is JULY 5, 1966. The use is limited to 0.05 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

1130' SOUTH and 1430' EAST from the NW CORNER of SECTION 27, BEING WITHIN
THE NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, OF SECTION 27, T1S, R3W, WM.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

4.0 ACRES SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
SECTION 27
TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by the prior Certificate 48412, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT cancelled by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 13, 1996.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610, pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said permit.
