CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

DARRELL AND LUELLA FRIEND P.O. BOX 41 ASHWOOD, OREGON 97711

confirms the right to use the waters of TROUT CREEK, a tributary of the DESCHUTES RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 27.0 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit 7320. The date of priority is MAY 25, 1925. The right is limited to not more than 0.34 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The new point of diversion is located as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 36, T 9 S, R 16 E, W.M.; 1000 FEET NORTH AND 300 FEET EAST FROM THE CENTER OF SECTION 36.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4 5.5 ACRES SW 1/4 NE 1/4 18.0 ACRES NE 1/4 NW 1/4 3.5 ACRES SECTION 36 TOWNSHIP 9 SOUTH, RANGE 16 EAST, W.M.

The following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the user is entitled;

the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old points of diversion and shall not exceed 0.34 cubic foot per second.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION AND PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MAY 5, 1978, and supersedes Certificate 8788, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

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The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
