CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

M.L. OLIVER
SISTERS, OREGON 97759

confirms the right to use the waters of BIG SLOUGH (aka Indian Ford Creek), a tributary of SQUAW CREEK, for IRRIGATION OF 7.3 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for CROOK County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 1, at Page 120. The date of priority is 1905.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.15 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

OLIVER DITCH, SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 16, T 14 S, R 10 E, WM; 25 FEET NORTH AND 790 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER, SECTION 16.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ 4.7 ACRES
SECTION 21

NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ 2.6 ACRES
SECTION 28

TOWNSHIP 14 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST, W.M.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 292, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered AUG 22 1997, approving Transfer Application 6615.

The issuance of this superceding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
