CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

FRED G. HEID AND SON ROUTE 2, BOX 2734 VALE, OREGON 97918

confirms the right to use the waters of TWO WELLS, tributaries of WILLOW CREEK BASIN for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 91.40 ACRES OF LAND.

This right was perfected under Permit U-491 and Permit U-492. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 3, 1952.

The use is limited to 1.14 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or it's equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

- #23- Well: 2600 feet North and 450 feet East from the South quarter corner Section 4, being within the NW4SE4, Section 4, Township 16 South, Range 43 East, W.M.
- #24- Well: 810 feet North and 460 feet East from the South quarter corner Section 4, being within the SW'4SE'4, Section 4, Township 16 South, Range 43 East, W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, providing further that the amount of water allowed herein, together with the amount of water secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein, and shall be still further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1.14 c.f.s.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
