CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM AND ELK CREEK, tributaries of SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE FAMILY.

This right was perfected under Permit 51448. The date of priority is OCTOBER 17, 1991. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND FROM THE UNNAMED STREAM WITH ANY DEFICIENCY TO BE MADE UP FROM ELK CREEK, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source. The use of water allowed herein, during the period of July 1 through October 31 of each year, is limited to human consumption, livestock consumption for such animals as are essential to the proper sustenance of the family and irrigation of a noncommercial garden not to exceed 1/2 acre in area.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

UNNAMED STREAM - NW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.; 1270 FEET SOUTH AND 1340 FEET WEST FROM THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 33; AND

ELK CREEK - SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.; 170 FEET NORTH AND 1450 FEET WEST FROM THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 33.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4  
SECTION 33  
TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.


Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
