## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

DELBERT AND NORANNE SPARKS 8818 BEN KERNS ROAD KLAMATH FALLS, OR 97601

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the KLAMATH RIVER BASIN for IRRIGATION OF 2.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11753. The date of priority is JULY 9, 1993. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.025 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 25, TOWNSHIP 39 SOUTH, RANGE 7 EAST, W.M.; 750 FEET SOUTH AND 300 FEET WEST FROM THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

## NE 1/4 SE 1/4 2.0 ACRES SECTION 25 TOWNSHIP 39 SOUTH, RANGE 7 EAST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

In the event of a request for a change in point of appropriation, an additional point of appropriation or alteration of the appropriation facility associated with this authorized diversion, the quantity of water allowed herein, together with any other right, shall not exceed the capacity of the facility at the time of perfection of this right.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
