County: Hood

Purpose: Providing required stream flows for migration, spawning, egg incubation, fry emergence, and juvenile rearing for bull trout, fall and spring chinook salmon, coho salmon, winter and summer steelhead, sea-run and resident cutthroat trout, redband trout and Pacific Lamprey.

The authorized stream reach for this instream water right is:

HOOD RIVER FROM POWERDALE DAM AT RM 4.5 (SW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 12, T2N, R10E, W.M.); TO THE MOUTH AT RM 0.5 (SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 25, T3N, R10E, W.M.)

The right is established under Oregon Revised Statutes 537.341.

The date of priority is October 8, 1998

The following conditions apply to the use of water under this certificate:

1. The right is limited to not more than the amounts, in cubic feet per second, during the time periods listed below and as further limited below:

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- 2. The water right holder shall measure and report the in-stream flow along the reach of the stream or river described in the certificate as may be required by the standards for in-stream water right reporting of the Water Resources Commission.
- 3. For purposes of water distribution, this instream right shall not have priority over human or livestock consumption.

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- 4. The instream flow allocated pursuant to this water right is not in addition to other instream flows created by a prior water right or designated minimum perennial stream flow.
- 5. The flows are to be measured downstream of Powerdale Dam as near to the dam as it is possible to find a site that will provide accurate measurements to protect necessary flows.
