CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

J. A. AND VIOLA F. MOORE 2992 SOUTH RIVER ROAD GRANTS PASS. OREGON 97527

confirms the right to use the waters of LOST CREEK RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-8142, a tributary of ROGUE RIVER, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 0.62 ACRE.

This right was perfected under Permit 52313. The date of priority is APRIL 28, 1995. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 2.79 ACRE-FEET STORED WATER, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

LOST CREEK RESERVOIR - NW 1/4, SECTION 26, TOWNSHIP 33 SOUTH. RANGE 1 EAST, W.M.; AND

ROGUE RIVER RE-DIVERSION - NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 14, TOWNSHIP 36 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.; 1810 FEET NORTH AND 124 FEET EAST OF THE SW CORNER OF SECTION 14.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to 4 ½ acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4 0.61 ACRE SW 1/4 SW 1/4 0.01 ACRE SECTION 14 TOWNSHIP 36 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of Water Service Contract No. 6-07-10-W1093 or a satisfactory replacement between the Bureau of Reclamation and the water user.

The water user shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

Failure to comply with any of the provision of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use, without waste, on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director of the Water Resources Department finds the use of water described by this right, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
