CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

SUTTLE LAKE UNITED METHODIST CAMP
13400 SUTTLE LAKE ROAD
SISTERS, OREGON 97759

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the SOUTH FORK LAKE CREEK BASIN for IRRIGATION OF 0.8 ACRE AND CAMP USE.

This right was perfected under Permit G-10875. The date of priority is APRIL 13, 1987. This right is limited to 11.43 GALLONS PER MINUTE (GPM), BEING 4.49 GPM FOR IRRIGATION AND 6.94 GPM FOR CAMP USE or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

LOT 1 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4), SECTION 24. T 13 S, R 8 E, W.M.; 430 FEET NORTH AND 260 FEET WEST FROM THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 24.

The amount of water used for irrigation together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.


The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. When required by the department, the water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use allowed under this right, is limited to appropriation of water only to the extent that it does not impair or substantially interfere with prior surface water rights as well as prior ground water rights of others.

The Water Resources Director made affirmative findings on this right regarding impact on stream flows in state scenic waterways on March 15, 1989.
