CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

RODNEY WILSON  
150 RATTLESNAKE CREEK ROAD  
GLENDALE, OR 97442

confirms the right to use the waters of RATTLESNAKE CREEK, a tributary of COW CREEK, for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY INCLUDING THE IRRIGATION OF LAWN AND NONCOMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE.

This right was perfected under Permit 51305. The date of priority is JANUARY 31, 1991. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND FOR DOMESTIC USE NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH JULY 14, FURTHER LIMITED DURING THE PERIOD OF JULY 15 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR TO HUMAN CONSUMPTION, LIVESTOCK CONSUMPTION FOR SUCH ANIMALS AS ARE ESSENTIAL TO THE PROPER SUSTENANCE OF THE FAMILY AND IRRIGATION OF A NONCOMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 2, TOWNSHIP 33 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.; 116 FEET SOUTH AND 306 FEET WEST FROM THE CENTER 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 2.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4  
SECTION 2  
TOWNSHIP 33 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

The water user shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the diversion. The required screen is to be in place, functional, and approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
