CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ALEXANDER MORNARICH  
569 CONIFER LANE  
GLIDE, OR 97443

confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED SPRING, a tributary of LITTLE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 3.5 ACRES, LIVESTOCK AND SUPPLEMENTAL DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD.

This right was perfected under Permit 52217. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 13, 1991. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.007 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.004 CFS FOR IRRIGATION, 0.001 CFS FOR LIVESTOCK AND 0.002 CUBIC CFS FOR SUPPLEMENTAL DOMESTIC USE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. IRRIGATION USE IS ALLOWED DURING THE PERIOD MARCH 1 THROUGH APRIL 30 OF EACH YEAR. SUPPLEMENTAL DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY IS ALLOWED FROM DECEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 30 OF EACH YEAR, AND LIMITED TO HUMAN CONSUMPTION AND DOMESTIC ANIMAL CONSUMPTION THAT IS ANCILLARY TO RESIDENTIAL USE OF THE PROPERTY FROM MAY 1 THROUGH NOVEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR. SUPPLEMENTAL DOMESTIC USE IS LIMITED TO ANY DEFICIENCY IN THE AVAILABLE SUPPLY OF ANY PRIOR RIGHT EXISTING FOR THE SAME LAND.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 2, TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.; 780 FEET SOUTH AND 140 FEET EAST FROM THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 2.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4 3.5 ACRES AND DOMESTIC  
SECTION 2  
TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the water user to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the water user to install a meter or

other measuring device, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

- B. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The water user shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the diversion. The water user shall also install a fishway at the obstruction that will provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screen and fishway are to be in place, functional, and approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.


The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds the use of water described by this right, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
