CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STANLEY AND KATHERINE VEJTASA
312 IMPALA DRIVE
ROSEBURG, OR 97470

confirms the right to use the waters of NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of UMPQUA RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD.

This right was perfected under Permit 51812. The date of priority is MAY 13, 1993. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) FOR DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED DURING THE PERIOD FROM OCTOBER 1 THROUGH AUGUST 31 OF EACH YEAR, AND FURTHER LIMITED TO 0.01 CFS FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF NON-COMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE IN AREA DURING THE PERIOD FROM SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

LOT 1 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4), SECTION 16, TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.; NORTH 77 DEGREES 9 MINUTES WEST 3700 FEET FROM THE SE CORNER OF SECTION 16.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

LOT 1 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4)
SECTION 16
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 days of the date of service.

- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The water user shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion. The required screen is to be in place and functional.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds the use of water described by this right, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
