CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

DAN HASSELL AND DIXIE JEWETT 40830 KINGSTON-JORDAN RD. SCIO, OR 97374

confirms the right to use the waters of DETROIT RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-1625, a tributary of SANTIAM RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 35.2 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 51754. The date of priority is JUNE 25, 1990. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 19.2 ACRE-FEET STORED WATER ONLY, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

DETROIT RESERVOIR - SW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 7, TOWNSHIP 10 SOUTH, RANGE 5 EAST, W.M.; AND

RE-DIVERSION POINT - NE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 14, TOWNSHIP 9 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.; 2630 FEET NORTH AND 1190 FEET WEST FROM THE S 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 14.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from storage.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 NW 1/4 14.5 ACRES SECTION 25

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 11.7 ACRES

NW 1/4 NE 1/4 9.0 ACRES

SECTION 26

TOWNSHIP 9 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 days of the date of service.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use of water under this permit is subject to the terms and conditions of Water Service Contract No. 5-07-10-W1037 or a satisfactory replacement between the Bureau of Reclamation and the water user, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

The use of water under this right is subject to the installation, maintenance, and operation of fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) to prevent fish from entering the diversion. The required screens and by-pass devices are to be in place, functional and approved by an ODFW.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds the use of water described by this right, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
