## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CITY OF GRANITE HCR 87, BOX 1 SUMPTER, OREGON 97877

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the GRANITE CREEK BASIN for MUNICIPAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11419. The date of priority is MAY 15, 1991. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 10.0 GALLONS PER MINUTE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 4, TOWNSHIP 9 SOUTH, RANGE 35 1/2 EAST, W.M.; 1000 FEET NORTH AND 390 FEET WEST FROM THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 4.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4 SECTION 3

S 1/2 NE 1/4 N 1/2 SE 1/4 SECTION 4

TOWNSHIP 9 SOUTH, RANGE 35 1/2 EAST, W.M.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 days of the date of service.


Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.
