CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of WOLF CREEK, a tributary of the POWDER RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 110.0 ACRES.

The right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for BAKER County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 6, at page 291. The date of priority is 1879.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

WALK DITCH - NE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 15, TOWNSHIP 6 SOUTH, RANGE 39 EAST, W.M.; 370 FEET SOUTH AND 490 FEET WEST FROM THE CENTER 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 15.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, IF AVAILABLE AT THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NE 1/4 SW 1/4 30.0 ACRES
NW 1/4 SW 1/4 40.0 ACRES
SECTION 14

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 40.0 ACRES
SECTION 15
TOWNSHIP 6 SOUTH, RANGE 39 EAST, W.M.

The diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable measuring device for measuring the water. The type and plans of the measuring device shall be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of the watermaster.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 days of the date of service.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 12, 1981, and together with certificate 50173, supersedes certificate 4214, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
