## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CHARLIE MCNEIL MERLIN, OR

confirms the right to use the waters of QUARTZ CREEK, a tributary of the JUMP OFF JOE CREEK, for IRRIGATION of 14.5 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 17252. The date of priority is August 28, 1946. This right is limited to 0.185 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or the equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or the equivalent, and 4.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 68077, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT canceled by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, and recorded in Special Order Volume 57, Page 511, canceling a portion of the water right. This certificate supersedes Certificate 68077.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights.
