CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

LINDA M. LONG
306 EAST 5TH STREET

confirms the right to use the waters of UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of THE PACIFIC OCEAN, for IRRIGATION OF 22.43 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 50932. The date of priority is OCTOBER 13, 1989. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.28 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

LOT 3 (SW 1/4 SE 1/4), SECTION 29, TOWNSHIP 24 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.; 370 FEET NORTH AND 440 FEET EAST FROM THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 29.

The amount of water used for irrigation together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 days of the date of service.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

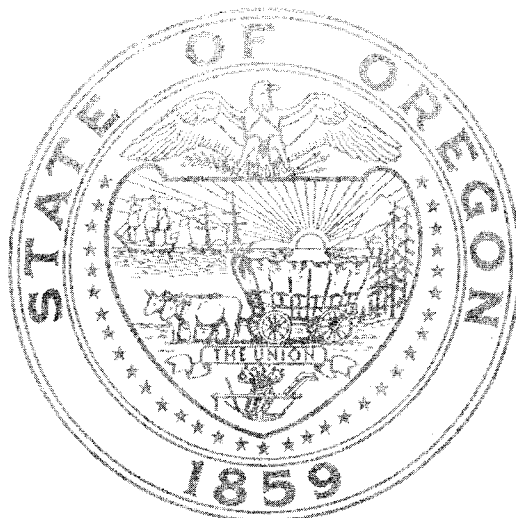
By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
