 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

H.A. CORLISS  
 ROUTE 3  
 GRANTS PASS, OREGON 97526

confirms the right to use the waters of GREEN'S CREEK, a tributary of ROGUE RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 14.77 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 4928. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 5, 1921. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.18 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), or the equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 4834, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered June 2, 2004, and recorded in Special Order Volume 60, page 158, approving a petition by Grants Pass Irrigation District under ORS 541.329.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
