CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

NEIL J. RANDOL

confirms the right to use the waters of THE NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of THE UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 2.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 50799. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 5, 1989. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.025 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

LOT 1 (NE 1/4 NE 1/4), SECTION 18, TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.; 830 FEET SOUTH AND 1240 FEET WEST FROM THE NE CORNER OF SECTION 18.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 2.0 ACRES  
SECTION 18  
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 days of the date of service.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be maintained and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.


Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCTOBER 15, 2001, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
