CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of RHEA CREEK, a tributary of WILLOW CREEK, for IRRIGATION of 8.5 acres.

This right was perfected under Permit S-11692. The date of priority is May 28, 1935. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.1 CUBIC FOOT FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the original point of diversion, NE% SW%, SECTION 25, T 1 S, R 24 E, W.M..

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed ONE-SIXTIETH cubic foot per second per acre.

The authorized point of diversion is located as follows:

NW1/4 NE1/4, SECTION 25, T 1 S, R 24 E, W.M.; 1150 FEET NORTH AND 50 EAST FROM SW1/4 CORNER OF THE NW1/4 NE1/4, SECTION 25.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NE¼ NW¼ 5.8 ACRES SECTION 25

TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 24 EAST, W.M.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-080 and OAR 690-01-005 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order.

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This certificate is issued to confirm an HISTORIC CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered 0CT 0.4.2004, approving Transfer Application 9466 and supercedes Certificate 11741, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to the following additional conditions:

- 1. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 2. Prior to October 1, 2006, the water user shall install and maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.
