## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

PETER J. PON ROUTE 2, BOX 1410 ROSEBURG, OR 97470

confirms the right to use the waters of the NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of the UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 46.93 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 24057. The date of priority is February 15, 1956. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.589 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or the equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or the equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall further be limited to a diversion not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right described by Certificate 80522, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT canceled by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director approving Transfer Application T-7079 entered on January 20, 2004, and recorded in Special Order Volume 59, Page 108.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
