confirms the right to use the waters of ONE WELL in the MALHEUR RIVER BASIN for IRRIGATION OF $4.7\ \text{ACRES}$.

This right was perfected under Permit G-10885. The date of priority is OCTOBER 6, 1986. This right is limited to 0.059 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 7, TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 47 EAST, W.M.; 2934 FEET NORTH AND 1016 FEET WEST FROM THE S 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7.

The amount of water used for irrigation together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.4 ACRES NE 1/4 SW 1/4 4.3 ACRES

SECTION 7

TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 47 EAST, W.M.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the 60 days of the date of service.

The water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of groundwater withdrawn.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
