## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

SAMUEL CUMMINGS ROUTE 1, BOX 127 MILTON-FREEWATER, OR

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL, a tributary of WALLA WALLA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 8.32 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-1025. The date of priority is July 14, 1958. This right is limited to 0.10 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or the equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of appropriation from the source.

The point of appropriation is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or the equivalent for each acre irrigated, and is further limited to a diversion not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 31522, State Record of Water Right Certificates, CORRECTED by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered January 24, 2005, and recorded in Special Order Volume 63, Page 125.

This certificate supersedes Certificate 31522.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
