CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

FLORENCE DOBBIN
UNION, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of CATHERINE CREEK for TRACT #1 and LITTLE CREEK for TRACT #2, for IRRIGATION OF 229.4 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Department, in Volume 8, Page 1. The date of priority is 1870 for TRACT #1 and 1863 for TRACT #2.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 3.0 acre feet per acre in any irrigation season diverted at a rate not to exceed ONE-FORTIETH of a cubic foot per second per acre.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 6236, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT canceled by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director in PC 03-03 entered MAR 0 1 2005, and recorded in Special Order Volume 63, Page 275, canceling a portion of the water right. This certificate supersedes Certificate 6236.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
