CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of the Deschutes River, a tributary of the Columbia River, for Irrigation of 100.7 acres and Domestic for one family.

This right was perfected under Permit 15920. The date of priority is May 12, 1944. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 1.271 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), being 1.261 CFS for Irrigation and 0.01 CFS for Domestic, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SW % SE %, Section 26, T14S, R12E, W.M.; 765 feet North and 215 feet West from the SE Corner, SW % SE %, Section 26.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent, and 3.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, subject to conditions and limitations set out in the stipulation of August 1, 1944, between the Arnold Irrigation District and the holder of this right as recorded on Page 1250 in Volume 2 of the Miscellaneous Records of the State Engineer and further subject to the conditions designated in the Waiver of August 22, 1944, by James W. C. Pogue recorded on Page 1251, Volume 2 of the Miscellaneous Records of the State Engineer.
