CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

E. B. KNOX

POST OR 97752

confirms the right to use the waters of NEWSOME CREEK, a tributary of the CROOKED RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 81.3 ACRES, STOCK AND DOMESTIC USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Crook County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the State Water Board for the State of Oregon, in Volume 1, at Page 449. The date of priority is 1879 for the irrigation of Tract No. 2; and from 1908 for the irrigation of Tract No. 1.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed a reasonable amount for domestic and stock use, and 1.02 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND for irrigation, the total quantity being limited to 4.0 ACRE FEET per acre during each year, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
