confirms the right to use the waters of Wells No. 1 and 2 in the INDIAN FORD CREEK BASIN, a tributary of the SQUAW CR BASIN for IRRIGATION of 153.22 ACRES AND MAINTENANCE OF TWO PONDS FOR AESTHETICS.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11117. The date of priority is JANUARY 13, 1988. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 2.25 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS); BEING 1.92 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.33 CFS FOR AESTHETICS, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The wells are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may required the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

This certificate is issued in accordance with OAR 690-380-6010 to describe the water right for a non-completed change in point of diversion approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 17, 2004, at Special Order Volume 60, Page 77, approving Transfer 9074. This certificate supersedes Certificate 80465, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
