 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON
 WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of the DESCHUTES River, a tributary of the COLUMBIA River, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 9, at Page 453. The date of priority is OCTOBER 31, 1900 and DECEMBER 2, 1907. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed the following rates:

Season	April 1 – April 30	May 1 – May 14	May 15 – September 14	September 15 – September 30	October 1 – October 31
Rate	1.25 cfs	1.67 cfs	3.09 cfs*	1.67 cfs	1.25 cfs

The priority date is October 31, 1900, unless otherwise specified.

*2.20 cfs having a priority date of October 31, 1900, and 0.89 cfs having a priority date of December 2, 1907.

The description of the stream reach in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

From the location of the diversion authorized previously under Certificate 76358, located at:


To LAKE BILLY CHINOOK at River Mile 120.

The instream right established by this allocation of conserved water shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470, unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 76358, and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ALLOCATION OF CONSERVED WATER approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 67, Page 158, approving conserved water application C-29, and together with a remaining right to be issued by the Department, supercedes Certificate 76358, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
