A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STEVE AND MARY WALPORT
2308 UPPER APPLGATE ROAD
JACKSONVILLE, OREGON 97530

confirms the right to use the waters of the LITTLE APPLGATE RIVER, a tributary of the APPLGATE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 0.5 ACRE AND STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for JACKSON County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 4, at Page 1. The date of priority is September 1, 1857.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.0125 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (IF AVAILABLE AT THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION: FARMER'S DITCH LOCATED IN THE NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 14, T 39 S, R 3 W, W.M.; ORIGINAL COORDINATES: 350 FEET SOUTH AND 900 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER OF SECTION 14) or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 3, T. 39 S., R. 3 W., W.M.; 100 feet South and 1630 feet West from the Center $\frac{1}{4}$ Corner of Section 3.

NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 14, T. 39 S., R. 3 W., W.M.; Farmer's Ditch – Original coordinates: 350 feet South and 900 feet West from the NE Corner of Section 14.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available the original point of diversion.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ 0.5 ACRE
SECTION 3
TOWNSHIP 39 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.


When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall install and maintain a fish screen and by-pass device. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and shall be installed under the supervision of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 22, 2004, and supersedes Certificate 16407, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
