A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, a tributary of the GRANDE RONDE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 25.6 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit 27863. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 20, 1962. The right is limited to not more than 0.33 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND FF AVAILABLE AT THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION LOCATED WITHIN THE SW 1/4 W 4, SECTION 9, TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 39 EAST, W 1/4 W 1/4 SECTION 520 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER, SECTION 10 FEET NOTE.

The point of diversion
