CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

USDI, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE  
JOHN DAY FOSSIL BEDS NATIONAL MONUMENT  
HCR 82, BOX 126  
KIMBERLY, OREGON 97848

confirms the right to use the waters of the JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for the purpose of SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 15.77 ACRES.

The right has been perfected under Permit 49554. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 13, 1983. The right is limited to not more than 0.26 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 7, T 12 S, R 26 E, W.M.; 1060 FEET NORTH AND 1150 FEET WEST FROM THE SE CORNER OF SECTION 7.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.


A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 75792, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered June 1, 2006, approving Transfer Application 8683 for AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
