

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of DEER CREEK, a tributary of SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, for GENERAL MILL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit 17089. The date of priority is MAY 21, 1946. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 1.0 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4, AS PROJECTED WITHIN S. HARKNESS DLC 41, SECTION 15, TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.; 1300 FEET SOUTH AND 600 FEET WEST FROM THE NE CORNER OF DLC 41.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

When in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the water user is entitled;

the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in USE OF THE WATER approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered July 13, 1982, and supersedes Certificate 20347, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
