

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

RALPH GOODWIN

confirms the right to use the waters of the SOUTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of the JOHN DAY RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATION OF 25.0 ACRES.

The right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for GRANT County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 15, at page 461. The date of priority is 1873.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.625 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (IF AVAILABLE AT THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION: LESTER DITCH: NW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 7, T 13 S, R 27 E, W.M.; 6550 FEET NORTH AND 500 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 6), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

LOT 2 (SW 1/4 NW 1/4), SECTION 6, T 13 S, R 27 E, W.M.; 2280 FEET SOUTH AND 30 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER, SECTION 6.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre to June 1 and ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; and

further limited to a diversion of 1.0 acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and 4.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season, April 1 to September 30, of each year.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

SW 1/4 NW 1/4 25.0 ACRES
SECTION 6
TOWNSHIP 13 SOUTH, RANGE 27 EAST, W.M.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion under the subject right.

When in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the wateruser is entitled;

the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MAY 7, 1984, approving Transfer Application 5407, and together with certificate 52028, supersedes certificate 25195, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
