CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

G.W.MCFARLANE
SISTERS, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of WHYCHUS CREEK (formerly know as Squaw Creek), a tributary of the DESCHUTES RIVER in Deschutes County for IRRIGATION of 30 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 120. The date of priority is 1880.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.62 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 291, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered ~~OCT 12 2005~~, approving Transfer Applications T-8900 and T-8902. In addition, it correctly describes the County in which the place of use is located.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
